At the conclusion of the dancing, most dancers stayed on to share the food that they had brought along in a pot luck tea. All in all, it was a great afternoon.

DANCING THE HEYSEN TRAIL WITH FUNI AND WANG WANG

Among the nine dancers from Canberra and District who danced the Heysen Trail at the 35th Australian Winter School in Adelaide, were two of our newer dancers, Madeleine Johnson and Cathy Jones. For Georgina Kingston, a junior dancer from Adaminaby, Adelaide 2010 was her 6th Australian Winter School.

The two overseas teachers were Elinor Vandegrift, Seattle, USA (see also next item), and Jim Rae, Lockerbie, Scotland. Barbara Hamlyn and Noriel Tarca, Adelaide, and Cathy McLeod, Queensland, completed the teaching staff. Personnel from the well known UK band Craigellachie and the Balmoral Band of Queensland/New Zealand origin provided the music for classes and socials.

Class teaching was of a high standard, leaving dancers tired but "enthused". Dancing at the socials was energetic and fun-filled. Canberra & District was represented at the Ceilidh: Alan McCulloch sang to the

accompaniment of Madeleine Johnson. Madeleine also performed in the ladies' step dance display, her first attempt at ladies' step – well done Madeleine. Georgina assisted that perennial performer from Melbourne, Pam Jones, in her tap dancing routine – Georgina may have stolen the show on this item.

On the free day, many dancers visited the pandas, Funi and Wang Wang. We don't know if anyone actually ventured onto the Heysen Trail, the 1,200 kilometre-long walking-trail named after Sir Hans Heysen, the German Australian artist famous for his watercolours of the South Australian bush. An exhibition of his works was recently on display at the Australian National Gallery here in Canberra.

Congratulations are extended to the Adelaide Winter School Committee led by Andrew and Mechthild Timmins and Jill and Neville Pope. VISITING OVERSEAS TEACHER

On 21 July, Canberra dancers were treated to a most enjoyable lesson from visiting overseas teacher Elinor Vandegrift, at a special class organised by the Branch. Elinor, born in Scotland but resident for many years in Seattle, USA, was visiting Australia with her husband Dave, primarily to teach at her second Australian Winter School, her first one having been at the 25th in Canberra in Y2K.

The evening started with Elinor leading some brisk warm-up movements to reel-time music followed by exercises to waltz-time music. Then followed a warm-up dance, *The Bramble Circle*, from the US publication *Let's All Dance*, danced in a circle. This dance starts with all facing the centre of the circle, men with their partners on their right. Elinor next took the class through an instructive session of step practice to stimulate body and mind. The two central dances, *The Spirit of the Dance* and *The Music and the Dance*, combined novel formations (e.g. set and rotate for three couples) with more well-known movements, and the precise tuition yielded pleasing results. The supporting dances, *The Compleat Gardener* and *Summer Wooing*, completed what was a very fine class.
